We will host Dr. Kana Noshiro-Miyata, Assistant Professor of Medicine for the Division of Nephrology at Saint Louis University. After graduating from the medical faculty of Tokyo Medical and Dental University, Dr. Miyata continued her training in nephrology in Japan, eventually completing her internship at the US Naval Hospital in Okinawa. From there, she moved to the US and completed a residency at the Mount Sinai Beth Israel Hospital in New York and a fellowship in nephrology at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center in California. In recent years, she was a postdoctoral research fellow in the Laboratory of Molecular Nephrology and Endocrinology, at the University of Montreal. Currently, she works in St. Louis and continues her practice of nephrology and internal medicine, playing an active role in the fields of clinical medicine, education and research. As a professional who has successfully balanced clinical medicine and research, we are looking forward to hearing Dr. Miyata's views on "the career of a female doctor" and "practicing clinical medicine overseas."
